

Delightful Decomposers Scavenger Hunt

Materials:

- Scavenger Hunt Card
- Colored pencil or other writing implement

Instructions:

On the next page is a scavenger hunt full of decomposers. There are many different types of species that help break down dead plant and animal remain into soil. All of these can be found on our property but many can also be found elsewhere if you downloaded the packet and are following along from home. Walk on the LLNF trail or somewhere else in nature, try to find these species, and learn more about the process of decomposition!

Compost Stew

Materials:

- Solo cup (or other container)
- Pipe cleaner

Instructions:

Create a delicious meal for an earthworm! While walking the LLNF trails or anywhere else in nature, collect organic matter and put it in the solo cup. Organic material is anything that was alive and is now in or on the soil, like leaves. If it can rot or break down, then it is biodegradable, also known as compost. Once you are happy with the amount of food you collected, bend the pipe cleaner to make it look like a worm and place it in the cup. Worms are decomposers and help break organic material down.
