Precipitation Monitor

Help us collect daily rainfall data for Nantucket. The Linda Loring Nature Foundation is soliciting volunteers to assist us in collecting daily precipitation data. These data contribute to a national database as part of the Community Collaborative Rain, Hail and Snow Network (CoCoRaHS) and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration.

Volunteers must read and record the rainfall gauge each morning sometime between 7am and 9am. Volunteer for one or two days (or more) a week and take a walk on the trails when you're done! Please contact the Director of Research and Education for more information (stbois@llnf.org).
